When you teach your children to save, you're providing them with a lifetime lesson. Here are three ideas to get you started:

1. Help your kids decorate a box or jar to collect spare change or the portion of their allowances, gifts, or money from chores they are saving. Set up a regular interval to take the funds to deposit in their Share Savings Accounts at the credit union.
2. Decide on common savings goals, both short-term, like a new television, and a long-term one, say a future vacation trip to Disneyworld.
3. Set up a 401.k-type match program. Establish appropriate requirements, for example, the money must be tucked away in their Share Savings Account for a certain amount of time or you agree to a maximum match.

Remind your kids that saving money now is the way to get the things they want in the future.
