

Did You Miss Us? Night Depository Has You Covered



Endorse any checks as "for deposit only," and clearly and legibly write your name and account number on the envelope. Then just drop it in the night depository. You can be on your way, knowing that your deposit is safe and secure. We'll process the transaction when the credit union opens the next business day. That's it: Easy-peasy.
