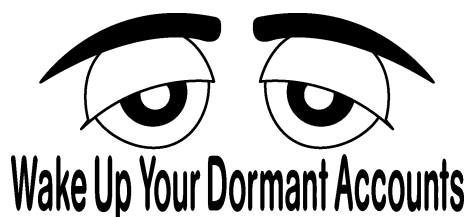

You can shop for the vehicle that suits your fancy, not be limited to the slow-moving models with the "special financing" offers. And, as with all affairs of the heart, use your head, too. Before stepping onto a dealer's lot, do your homework at [edmunds.com](http://edmunds.com) or [kbb.com](http://kbb.com) (Kelley Blue Book) or other sites such as [cars.com](http://cars.com) so that you can level the playing field. The dealer sells cars every day; you buy one, at most, every few years.*



### **ALERT: That Dormant Account Could Be Costing You Money!**

*Did you know that an account that's been inactive for over a year could be a potential liability? In fact, if you have such an account you could be racking up monthly fees. Oftentimes, members may forget about or lose track of an old account, unaware that once it has gone dormant and the balance dips below \$100, your credit union will begin to issue a monthly fee.*

*Luckily, reactivating your sleeping account is an easy fix. To bring your account current and remove the dormant flag, just conduct any of the following simple transactions:*

- 1. Make a deposit into your Primary Share (Savings) Account**
- 2. Make a withdrawal from your Primary Share (Savings) Account**
- 3. Authorize Direct Deposit from external sources such as payroll or social security**

### On The Move? Keep Us Posted

No matter if your family is growing and you need more space or your nest is empty and you are ready to downsize, 2374-00 be sure to keep the credit union in the loop. We need your physical mailing address, even if most of your transactions are electronic. That way you won't miss important tax forms, any re-issues of plastic cards, or other information. Contact the credit union for a change-of-address form. The U.S. Postal Service also offers an online form that allows you to update your address information. Go to [usps.com](http://usps.com) and click on "quick tools" and select "change of address" from the drop-down menu. You can use the online form for both temporary and permanent moves. To verify your identity, a major credit card associated with your address will be charged \$1.05.

Also, please keep us informed of your travel plans to avoid having transactions on your debit 1746-00 card denied. Identifying transactions outside of your typical spending patterns is one of the precautions in place to help determine if your card has been stolen.
